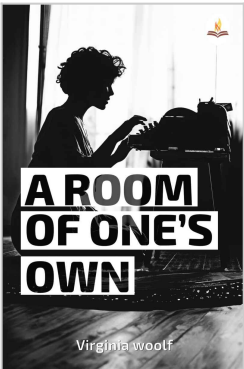

Virginia Woolf

Adeline Virginia Woolf was a prominent English writer and one of the key figures of modernist literature, known for her innovative narrative techniques, such as stream of consciousness. Woolf explored complex themes related to identity, gender, and the human experience. Born in London into a literary family, she began writing at a young age and became a central figure in the Bloomsbury Group, a collective of writers, artists, and intellectuals.
